

What: U.S. Department of the Air Force (DAF) Public Scoping

The DAF invites you to remotely participate in public scoping for the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) addressing the KC-46A Main Operating Base #6 (MOB 6) Beddown at either MacDill Air Force Base (AFB), Florida (Preferred Alternative) or Fairchild AFB, Washington. The DAF is proposing to beddown 24 KC-46A tanker aircraft at an active-duty AFB within the continental United States. This would require infrastructure, facilities, airfield operations, training activities, and personnel to support the KC-46A mission.

When and Where: 30 days beginning with publication of the Notice of Intent in the *Federal Register*

In lieu of in-person meetings, public scoping is being conducted via the project website at www.kc46amob6eis.com due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and in accordance DAF policy and the 2020 version of the Council of Environmental Quality's National Environmental Policy Act regulations at 40 Code of Federal Regulations Part 1506.6. The website provides a project presentation, fact sheet, and other scoping materials, and is the primary forum for accessing information on the project and the EIS. The website also provides downloadable comment forms that can be attached to email or returned by postal mail in as well as the capability to submit comments online.
